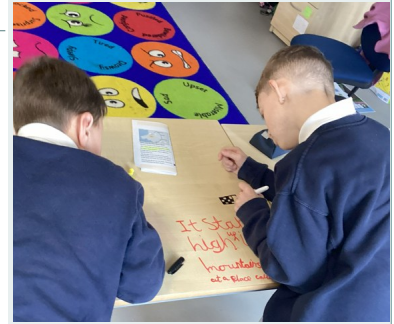


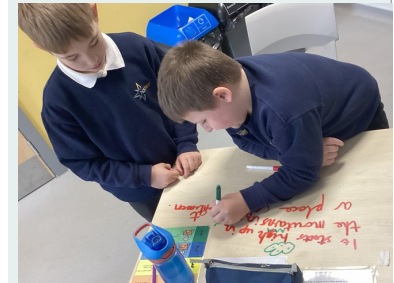

It has been an incredibly busy term with lots going on. As the term draws to a close I'd like to thank parents and carers for their continued support.

Our Tutors/Teachers speak regularly to feedback on your child's day, discuss issues and achievements and share school news. As our students are only ever here with us temporarily we also hold regular termly reviews to discuss next steps. During these meetings we discuss your child's readiness to return to school and their individual educational plan targets. This sets out the steps of progress being made. Your home school will be part of this meeting and they are sometimes joined by the IncludedED team from the Loal Authority who arrange placements with us.



Our Tutors/ Teachers are always available to talk should you ever need to discuss anything else. I often see parents/carers catching up with their Teacher at the end of the day. We wholeheartedly encourage this as it builds a close relationship between home and school. Sometimes, this is not always possible, if a child is not ready to have or hear a conversation. In these situations, do please ring in to school for a conversation.

One conversation which we find we often have is around uniform. Included on the last page is uniform guide. We ask all students to wear uniform and Tutors/ Teachers will discuss with you if your child arrives for school not in uniform. As we start next term we will be aiming for student's best efforts in this area.

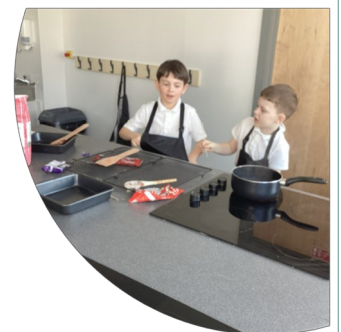
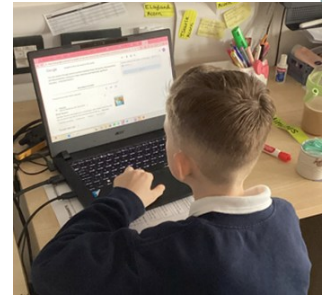

We have also started learning about the life of Anne Frank, using her experiences to inspire our own diary writing in role.

Oak In science Oak class has been experimenting with the impact of acids on enamel, the layer that protects our teeth. In Project we have been learning about Anne Frank who lived in a secret annexe in a house in Amsterdam during WWII. As part of that we are currently acquiring the skills to write a diary entry ourselves.

Primary School Uniform

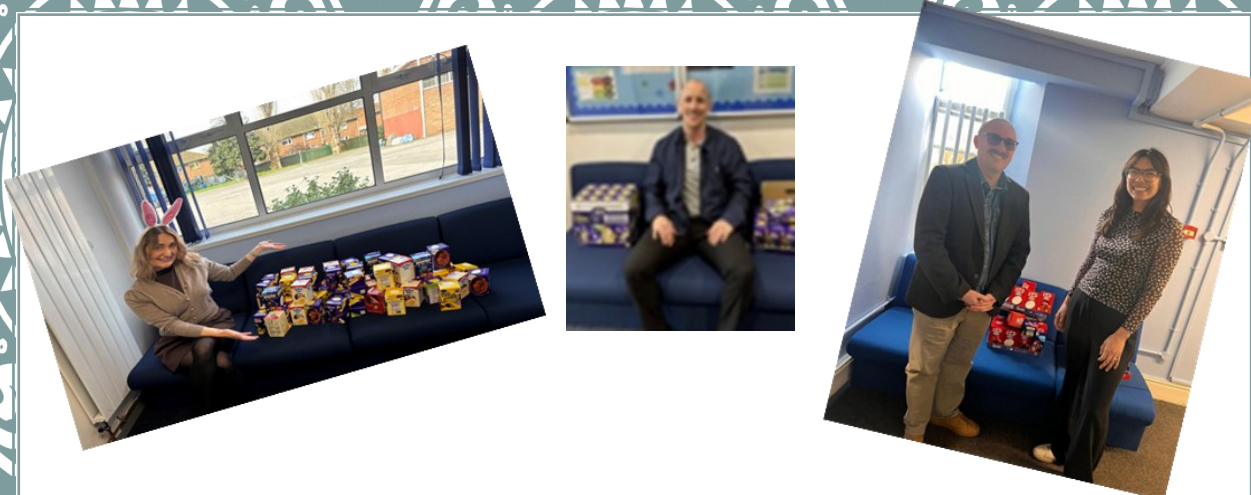
- Black trousers OR school skirt
